


DAVID W. GUION

Pianist-composer, whose song "Home On the Range" is a White House favorite, was born in the little cowtown of Ballinger, in western Texas, December 15, 1895, and is of French Huguenot descent. His grandfather, John I. Guion, was Governor of Mississippi. His father, of the same name, was one of the most distinguished lawyers in Texas at the turn of the century. His mother, Armour de Fentresse, of Norman descent, was a gifted pianist and singer.

If he had not heard the call of music, he might have become a lawyer or rancher, his father having been successful in both occupations, but his mother's love of music predominated and, at the age of eight, young David was started on his musical career. His musical studies led him abroad at the close of his formal schooling in Whipple Academy in Jacksonville, Illinois, and in Polytechnic College, Fort Worth, Texas. After three years' study under Leopold Godowsky of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Vienna, Guion returned to New York for further study, and in 1918 published his first composition.

The long list of Mr. Guion's original compositions and piano transcriptions of old fiddle tunes and breakdowns includes many works that are favorites with music lovers throughout the United States and Europe. His songs and piano pieces are performed by celebrated artists, and his orchestral numbers are frequently heard at concerts and on the radio. A "Western Ballet" made up entirely of Mr. Guion's western tunes was performed in Europe and America for four

successive seasons by Catherine Littlefield and the Philadelphia Ballet Company. Another ballet, "Shingandi" (Primitive African Ballet), was produced in Hollywood Bowl and Dallas Bowl by Theodore Kosloff and his ballet company. The music of this ballet has been played by orchestras under the direction of Paul Whiteman, Erno Rapée, Hans Kindler, Constantin Bakaleinikoff and Paul van Katwijk.

A distinguished member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, Guion was the first composer to bring a cowboy production before the critical eyes of New York City. This production was held over for two weeks at the Roxy Theatre, and at that time Guion donned a tengallon hat and cowboy regalia and participated in the show made up entirely of his own compositions. From the stage Guion went on the air, playing thirty-two weeks over the NBC and Mutual hookups. He was the first to use cowboy sound effects over the radio, intensifying the program's interest by inserting typical cowboy yells, the sound of horses' hooves, and so forth. After having appeared in an all-Guion program at Carnegie Hall in 1936, he was called upon to write the music for the Cavalcade of Texas. Guion has been termed America's foremost authority on both Western and Southern folk music.

Six years ago, Guion gave up his Greenwich Village studio and bought a forty-acre farm in the Pocono Mountains of Pennsylvania. The name of the estate is, of course, "Home on the Range".
